

Implementation of Oriented-Project Planning in the Development of Cultural Assets in Residency Infrastructure Writing Cultural Stories of the Pacitan Smart Community

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ABSTRACT

This article discusses the implementation of Oriented-Project Planning (OPP) in the development of cultural assets through a writing residency infrastructure for cultural stories in the Pacitan Cerdas Community. This community service program aims to enhance the appreciation and understanding of local culture and develop writing skills for cultural stories. The methodology includes result-oriented project planning, writing training, and intensive mentoring. The results indicate that the application of OPP significantly improves participants' writing skills and produces written works that reflect the richness of local culture. Additionally, this program strengthens community networks and promotes Pacitan culture to a broader audience. In conclusion, the implementation of OPP in cultural asset development provides a positive contribution to the preservation and promotion of local culture through the writing residency infrastructure.

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1. INTRODUCTION

Culture is an important element in people's lives that reflects the identity, values and history of a community. In Indonesia, cultural wealth is spread widely from Sabang to Merauke, covering various aspects such as language, customs, art and literature. However, along with the times and globalization, many local cultures are beginning to be marginalized and threatened with extinction (Sudianing & Sandiasa, 2020). Therefore, efforts to preserve and promote culture are very important to maintain one's cultural identity and heritage. Pacitan, a district in East Java, is known for its rich culture and history. The

Pacitan Smart Community is a local initiative that seeks to preserve and promote Pacitan culture through various educational and creative activities. One of the programs run by this community is a cultural story writing residency, which aims to explore, document and promote local cultural stories (Sakti, 2021).

The cultural story writing residency is a program designed to provide space for local and aspiring writers to learn, create and collaborate in a supportive environment. This program is expected to produce written works that reflect the rich culture of Pacitan, as well as improve participants' writing skills. To achieve this goal, the Pacitan Smart Community adopted an Oriented-Project Planning (OPP) approach in program planning and implementation. Oriented-Project Planning (OPP) is a project management approach that focuses on achieving specific and measurable results. This approach involves careful planning, structured implementation, and systematic evaluation to ensure that project objectives are achieved (Linggarwati et al., 2022). In the context of developing cultural assets through writing residencies, OPP is used to design effective and efficient programs, with measurable results in the form of written work and improvements in participants' skills.

The OPP approach in developing cultural assets through a cultural story writing residency at the Pacitan Smart Community includes several stages (Hutagalung & Hermawan, 2020). The first stage is a needs analysis, where the needs and cultural potential in Pacitan are identified. This information was collected through interviews with cultural figures, community surveys, and literature reviews. The results of this analysis are used to design curriculum and training materials that suit participant needs and program objectives. The second stage is program planning, which includes determining the goals, objectives and indicators of program success. In this stage, activity schedules, budgets, and monitoring and evaluation mechanisms are also designed. This careful and detailed planning aims to ensure that the program can run smoothly and achieve the expected results (Abbas & Sutrisno, 2022).

The third stage is program implementation, where training and mentoring activities are carried out for writing residency participants. Training includes techniques for writing cultural stories, ethnographic research, as well as documentation and publication techniques. Participants are given the opportunity to conduct field research, interview sources, and collect relevant data for their stories. During the implementation of the program, participants also receive intensive assistance from mentors who are experienced in the fields of writing and culture. The final stage is evaluation and dissemination of results. Evaluation is carried out to assess the effectiveness of the program and the achievement of the goals that have been set. Evaluation involves assessing the written work produced by participants, as well as feedback from participants and resource persons. The results of this evaluation are used to make improvements and development of the program in the future. Dissemination of results is carried out through the publication of participants' written works in the form of books, articles or other media, as well as through exhibitions and discussions involving the wider community (Wulandari et al., 2021).

The implementation of OPP in the residency program for writing cultural stories in the Pacitan Smart Community has shown positive results. Program participants are able to produce quality written work that reflects the rich culture of Pacitan. Apart from that, this program was also successful in improving participants' writing and research skills, as well as strengthening the cultural community network in Pacitan (Nurgiarta & Rosdiana, 2019). Through this activity, cultural stories that are currently little known can be documented and promoted, so that they can be accessed by future generations and the wider community. The success of this program shows that the OPP approach can be an effective model in developing cultural assets through creative and educational activities (Dwiningwarni et al., 2023; Nurmianto & Anzip, 2022). This program not only provides benefits for participants, but also for the community as a whole. By involving the community in the planning and implementation process of the program, this approach can also increase community participation and sense of ownership of their cultural heritage.

2. METHODS

Objective-Oriented Project Planning (OPP), or what is known as the Logical Framework Approach (LFA), is a systematic and goal-oriented project planning method. This method is used to plan, manage and evaluate projects efficiently and effectively (Lakhoua, 2020). OPP enables stakeholders to identify problems, define goals, formulate strategies, and set clear performance indicators. In the context of cultural asset development, OPP can be implemented to support cultural story writing residency infrastructure projects, as carried out by the Pacitan Smart Community. This project aims to preserve and develop local culture through story writing, as well as providing a platform for local writers to create and collaborate (Zen & Iswavigra, 2023).

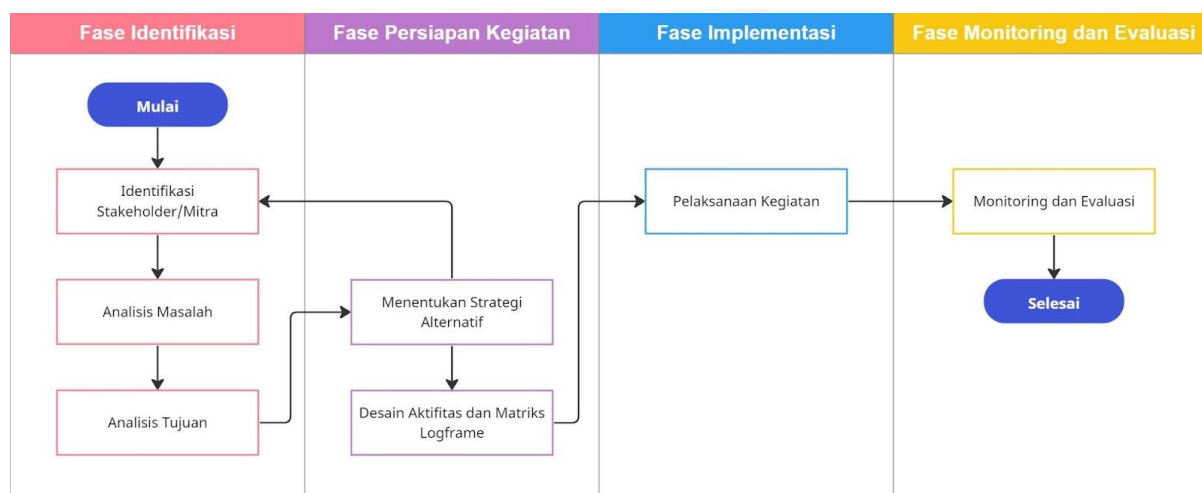


Figure 1. Objective-Oriented Project Planning (OPP) Method

The identification phase is the initial step in the OPP method. At this stage, an in-depth analysis of the problems faced by the cultural community in Pacitan is carried out. Identifying stakeholders or potential partners is an important step to ensure project success. The stakeholders involved include local governments, cultural institutions, local writers, and the general public who care about cultural preservation. Problem analysis includes collecting data regarding the obstacles faced in preserving cultural stories, such as lack of written documentation, lack of facilities for writers, and low public appreciation for local culture (Inayah et al., 2023). After that, a goal analysis is carried out to determine the results to be achieved. In this project, the main goal is to develop residency infrastructure that

supports cultural story writing activities. It is hoped that this infrastructure can become a center of cultural activity that provides space for writers to work, hold workshops and publish their work.

After the identification phase, the next step is the activity preparation phase. At this stage, alternative strategies are determined that can be used to achieve project goals. Each strategy is analyzed based on feasibility, costs, benefits, and impact on the community. Activity design and logframe matrix are the next steps in this phase. Activity design includes detailed planning regarding the activities that will be carried out during the project. For example, building a work space for writers, holding writing workshops, and publishing cultural story books. The logframe matrix is used to map the relationship between goals, outputs, outcomes and performance indicators. This matrix helps in monitoring and evaluating project progress, as well as ensuring that all activities carried out are in accordance with the stated objectives.

The implementation phase is the stage where the planned activities are implemented. At this stage, coordination and cooperation between the various parties involved is very important to ensure the smooth implementation of activities. Implementation of activities includes building residency infrastructure, holding workshops and training, as well as writing activities and publishing cultural stories (Pembayun et al., 2021). During this phase, monitoring and supervision is carried out periodically to ensure that all activities run according to plan and achieve the expected results. Implementation of activities does not only focus on physical aspects, but also on building the capacity of local writers. Writing workshops and training were held to improve their writing skills and understanding of the importance of preserving cultural stories. The implementation of Objective-Oriented Project Planning (OPP) in developing cultural assets, especially through the cultural story writing residency infrastructure in the Pacitan Smart Community, shows that this method is effective in planning, managing and evaluating projects systematically (Susanto et al., 2023). By going through the identification, activity preparation, implementation, and monitoring and evaluation phases, this project was able to achieve its goal of preserving and developing local culture through story writing. In addition, this project also provides significant benefits for local writers and the Pacitan community as a whole, as well as becoming a model for cultural preservation efforts in other areas.

3. FINDINGS AND DISCUSSION

3.1. Concept and Objectives of Oriented-Project Planning in Cultural Residencies

3.2. The Role and Benefits of Writing Residencies in Developing Cultural Assets

3.3. Project-Oriented Development and Implementation Strategies in Cultural Residencies

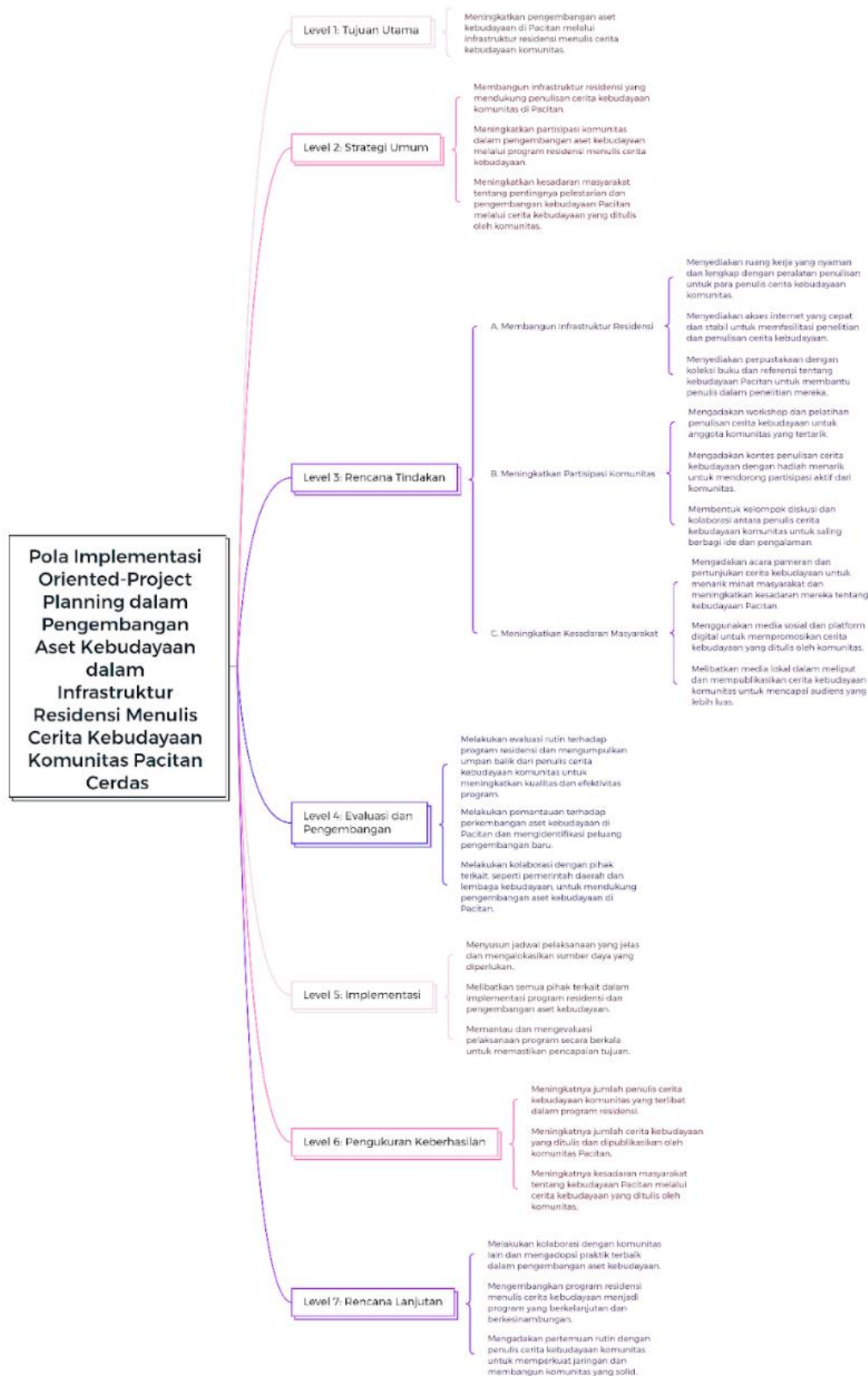


Figure 2. Implementation Strategies in Cultural Residencies
